A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PNC

"On behalf of the PNC, it is my pleasure and privilege to announce that after many, many hours of prayer, meetings, reading and prayer, the Lord has provided us with a Pastor for the congregation's call.

The Rev. Dr. Larry Thorson is currently the senior pastor at Hemet Presbyterian Church in Hemet, California (southern California). He was born and raised in San Jose, California. Larry has a MA in Theology from Fuller Seminary, a M. Div. from Union Seminary and a D.Min from Columbia. Pastor Larry has served in churches in Virginia, Texas and California.

He has a heart for missions, for childrens work (puppet ministries) and for new church development. He was a co-organizer of the Chino Hills Presbyterian Church in Los Angeles, and Legacy Presbyterian in Frisco, Texas, and understands the challenges of doing something anew in a community.

Larry is married to the Rev. Dr. Martha Thorson, who is a licensed family and marriage counselor. Daughter Kari will be married this March. Son Eric is working on a M. Education. They intend to live in San Jose, where they currently have a house.

The PNC unanimously approved issuing this call. We think he will bring much energy and enthusiasm to the harvest fields around IPC.

His Statement of Faith and fuller bio is attached (see page 2).

He will be preaching at IPC on February 23, 2013, followed by a congregational meeting to vote on the Call, and a reception for both Rev. Larry and Martha Thorson. We look forward to our congregation's welcoming of the Thorson's."

Autobiographical Sketch By The Reverend Dr. Larry D. Thorson

I was born in San Jose, California in 1956 and lived there with my parents and one older sister until I left for college in 1975. My father was a plumber and my mother a former teacher who worked as a "stay-at-home mom" during my school years. As a family we attended a Lutheran church (ELCA) where I was baptized as an infant and later completed the confirmation course.

In 1972, while a junior in high school, I experienced the presence of God in a personal way while recovering from a sports injury. I came to know Jesus Christ as my friend and savior and decided then to give my life to him in response. I became involved in a Campus Life Christian club and joined a large, fast growing non-denominational church. Not long after coming to know Christ, I sensed a call to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. My sister sensed the same call and followed the Lord as missionary to China and the former Soviet state of Kazakhstan.

I graduated from Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia in 1978 and while there began attending a Presbyterian Church U.S. for the first time. It was in the Rivermont Presbyterian Church of Lynchburg that I met my wife, Martha, who was a student at nearby Lynchburg College. We married in December of 1978 and moved to California where we both attended Fuller Theological Seminary.

While at Fuller Seminary we joined the First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood and began the long road to ordination. I graduated from Fuller with a MA in Theology and transferred to Union Theological Seminary in Virginia. I was ordained a PCUS minister in 1983 and served as pastor of the yoked Kentuck and Williamson Memorial Presbyterian Churches outside Danville, Virginia, associate pastor of the Little Falls Presbyterian Church in Arlington, Virginia, church development consultant for City Team Ministries in San Jose, California and co-organizing pastor along with my wife of the Chino Hills Presbyterian Church in suburban Los Angeles.

In January of 1999 my wife accepted a call as Associate Pastor of Congregational Life at the Highland Park Presbyterian Church in Dallas, Texas. I followed her to Dallas and was called as the associate pastor of pastoral care, missions and outreach at Grace Presbyterian Church in neighboring Plano. While in Plano, I earned my Doctor of Ministry degree at Columbia Theological Seminary in the area of new church development. Legacy Presbyterian Church of Frisco, Texas was the outgrowth of my final doctoral paper.

In August of 2005 I accepted a call as Senior Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Hemet in southern California. Hemet was a city going through major demographic changes as it transitioned from being primarily a retirement community to an urban city. My wife is a licensed marriage and family therapist working for Christian Counseling Services of Redlands. We have two children, Kari age 28, a graduate of Cal State University at Long Beach presently a recreation director for the city of Burlingame, California and Eric, age 23 who is working on his Masters in education at UC Riverside. God has blessed us with a beautiful joy filled home and wonderful opportunities to be of service for the Kingdom.

Theological Statement The Reverend Dr. Larry D. Thorson

THE REVEIEND DL. LAITY D. THUISUN

I believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is our creator, redeemer and sustainer. I worship God our sovereign Lord.

Being created by God, in the image of God, people were set apart with God. However, through a willful act of disobedience, the first man and woman fell out of fellowship with God. They became alienated from God and from each other. Through the sinful nature of our humanity, and through our own willful acts of disobedience, we find ourselves separated from our relationship with God. Sin is individual and corporate, permeating attitudes and actions of persons and societies. Human efforts to restore that broken relationship are ineffective.

Our reconciliation was accomplished by Jesus Christ, God incarnate. Being fully divine and fully human, Jesus Christ restored us to a right relationship with God through his life, death and resurrection. Through faith in Christ we receive the promise of life in fellowship with God now and for eternity. Christ's voluntary death on the cross paid the price for our sin and released us from sin's power. Through his resurrection we receive power over death. It is through the enabling power of the Holy Spirit that one

receives and exercises the faith to trust Christ for this saving reconciliation to God. As a father has compassion on his children, so God had compassion on us while we were yet sinners, providing our salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. I trust Jesus as our Lord and Savior. As a mother nurtures and comforts her children, so God nurtures and comforts us through the Holy Spirit. We rely on the Holy Spirit daily for our spiritual life.

I believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be God's inspired authoritative Word of self-disclosure and redemptive love for humanity. As we read the Scriptures, the Holy Spirit confronts us with the reality of our sin and the gracious acts of God. Through Scripture we are guided and instructed in the ways we are to live out our faith in obedience to God.

The church is the body of all those throughout the world who profess faith in Jesus Christ, together with their children. The church is present whenever the body of believers is gathered for worship, fellowship, and nurture. The church is also present when it is scattered throughout the world for service and witness.

The Sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper are given to the church to celebrate the act by which we are reconciled to God. In baptism we are received into the community of God's people. Scripture promises salvation by faith and it says the promise is to you and to your children. In presenting their child for baptism, Christian parents profess their faith in the Holy Spirit's promise to lead their children to salvation, and they promise obedience to Christ to bring up the child to love and serve God. Persons who have not been baptized as children may testify to the reality of God's grace in professing their own faith in Jesus, being baptized and received into the membership of the church.

The Lord's Supper demonstrates the spiritual nourishment which believers receive from Christ to enable us to live more faithful lives. The breaking of bread and pouring of wine is done in obedience to Christ's command, in worship of him, and in thanksgiving for our salvation achieved through his body being broken and his life being poured out for us. Through the Lord's Supper, we have communion with Christ. Through faith these two sacraments exhibit and offer Christ's saving grace, though salvation is not limited to those who have received them. Through the sacraments, the visible Word contributes to full expression of the preached and written Word, pointing to the incarnate Word, Jesus Christ.

I believe the mission of the church is to bear witness to the promise of salvation in Jesus Christ. The church seeks to present the message of God in such a way that others are encouraged to believe in Christ as Savior, to repent and to obey Christ as Lord of all. Following the example of Jesus Christ, presenting the message of God involves the church in proclaiming the gospel, reconciling people and nations and meeting the physical needs of others.

I believe all Christians are called upon to be witnesses to God's love. Therefore, the true ministry of the church is conducted by all of its members. All members of the body of Christ are to exercise their abilities and gifts in ministry. Certain members are called by God to serve the church as elders, deacons and pastors who are to live in fidelity in marriage or chastity in singleness.

TRI CITY FREE BREAKFAST PROGRAM



In December 2013, an average of 160 guests were served per day. Highest day in December was 192 guests and 275 meals. Average meals were 212. Total December meals were 2,753 meals (first and seconds) with 655 provisions. The Program is feeding 9.9% more guests and serving 6.8% more meals in 2013 than in 2012.
