**Tri City Free Breakfast Program** – Clerk Highlights from Report submitted.

- 1. **Statistics** In January 2014, an average of 150 guests were served per day. Highest day in the month was 205 guests and 275 meals. Average meals were 203. Total January meals 2,841 meals (first and seconds) with 682 provisions. By comparison, December 2013 was an average of 160 guests served per day. Highest day in December was 192 guests and 275 meals. Average meals were 212. Total December meals 2,753 meals (first and seconds) with 655 provisions.
- 2. **Funding** No update on closing the gap. Fund Balance as of 12/31/13 was \$1,076.39. The TCFBP continues to operate at an un-sustainable deficit. We need to help TCFBP obtain online donations capability, and perhaps learn from other food programs.
- 3. **Discussions** The TCFBP is the source of our property tax issues. Discussion regarding the possibility of TCFBP flying under the Presbytery flag need to be followed up.
- 4. **Needs** The Breakfast Program is in need of <u>coffee mugs, luncheon sized plates and forks</u>. We seem to chip and break a few as we go along, so perhaps someone has extra that we could use. It's a good time to do Spring Cleaning. Donations can be turned into the kitchen on Sundays or give to Mary Lou Craig or Jeane Garrett.

### **CONGREGATIONAL MEETING**

Irvington Presbyterian Church Sanctuary Sunday, February 23, 2014

- 1) **Opening Prayer** by Moderator Randy Young at 11:45 a.m. immediately following the end of the worship service.
- 2) **Declaration of a Quorum** to hold the Meeting by the Clerk of Session *At IPC, 10 members present constitutes a quorum at this time.* There were 62 members present and 25 non members present.
- 3) **Pastoral Call-** The Pastor Nominating Committee recommended the election of the Rev. Dr. Larry Dean Thorson to be the Senior Pastor of Irvington Presbyterian Church, effective April 4, 2014, with the terms of the call as stated below which is within the approved budget of IPC for 2014.

Moderator held a forum for the congregation to ask questions to the PNC and to the candidate.

- 4) **ELECTION:** Electors passed out written ballots to members, collected them, and tallied a vote of 61Yes and One No to elect the Rev. Dr. Larry D. Thorson to be pastor. Electors were Mary Ellen McKowen, Pat Jeffries, Dave Wegener and Heather Ostdiek. Non members were given an opportunity to voice their opinion using a different colored advisory ballot. Their tally did not count towards passing or denying the motion. Non member friends voted 20 Yes, zero nays.
- 5) **DISMISSAL OF THE PNC** It was moved, seconded and approved to dismiss the Pastor Nominating Committee with gratitude and appreciation for their work, conditionally upon the installation of Pastor Thorson. Additional steps leading to the installation will be Presbytery San Francisco and Presbytery San Gabriel approving the call. The Pastor Nominating Committee was Ron Fong (chair), Lynnette Ariarthurai, Brook Mantia, Peter Bade and Mary Lee Starkel.
- 6) CLOSING PRAYER by the Moderator at 12:32 pm., followed by a welcome reception in the social hall for Pastor Larry Thorson and his wife, Rev. Martha Thorson.

Irvington Presbyterian Church Social Hall

- 1) **Opening Prayer** by Moderator Randy Young at 11:53 a.m.
- 2) **Declaration of a Quorum** to hold the Meeting by the Clerk of Session *At IPC, 10 members present constitutes a quorum at this time There were 35 members present. We also had 13 non members and four youth present too.*
- 3) Election and Installation Elder Nominating Committee presented Kathy Jeffries to the Elder Class of 2014
  - i) Candidate was voted into office unanimously.
  - ii) Installation and Ordination per Book of Order W4.400 happened immediately thereafter, thus concluding worship service.
- 4) State of the Church / Annual Report by Moderator and Clerk of Session.
  - i) Highlight Notes and Questions noted were
    - a) There is no perfect pastor and there will be adjustments
    - b) The budget had assumed no staff vacancies. The 2013 surplus instead of a deficit, stems from the unfilled Youth and Family Ministries Director from April; from the Senior Pastor vacancy from September on; and the new Hispanic church rental starting in the summer. These three factors turned around the budget. The 2014 budget plan calls for using some of the 2013 surplus.
    - c) We started paying \$10,000 in property taxes starting in the fall due to a dispute
    - d) Session deliberately did not hire an interim pastor. Everyone stepped up. We need to continue to step up and serve one another when the new pastor comes.
    - e) Acknowledgement of the hard work of the Pastor Nominating Committee
  - ii) Moved Seconded and Unanimously Approved Acceptance of the Annual Report

#### 5) Corporation Meeting

- i) Moved, Seconded and Unanimously Approved the Election of the 2014 Corporation Board Officers:
  - a) Lynnette Ariathurai; Secretary Dave Wegener; Treasurer - Kathy Jeffries
  - b) Nominations from the Floor none
