WEDDING SEASON

May and June are the peak of the wedding season. I have performed several weddings recently both here at IPC and in other lovely buildings. I share the joy and excitement of the wedding party and delight in the love that is expressed.

The bride and groom pledge to love each other, to care for each other, and to be faithful in marriage. The vows they make are the most important part of the ceremony. Yet it seems that many of the secular weddings I have been invited to recently omit these solemn promises. When I splice a couple together I tell them that love is more than a feeling; it is a policy, a decision they make every day to love each other, no matter what. That's what they promise.

Another reason I love weddings is that God takes marriage as a picture of His relationship with His people.

As a bridegroom rejoices over his bride, so will your God rejoice over you. (Isaiah 62:5)

Husbands, love your wives just as Christ loved the church and gave himself for her. (Ephesians 5:25)

Let us rejoice and be glad and give him glory! For the wedding of the Lamb has come and his bride has made herself ready. (Revelation 19:7)

The foundation of marriage, of course, is love. We see the beauty of Jesus, we are awed by the majesty and tenderness of the Father, the sweet presence of the Holy Spirit warms our hearts. He loves each of us, and we respond with fondness and even passion for the loveliness of our God. God is attractive.

Each partner in a marriage adapts to please the other. Out of love for Jesus he gives us the power to make changes in our lives, in our attitudes, in our ways of speaking, to be pleasing to the one we love. It is so good to, as it were, get a hug from Jesus at the beginning of each day.

At the start of the wedding the groom and groomsmen are lined up beside me. The music starts. The doors open. Everybody stands. As the bride enters on the arm of her father, spectacularly gorgeous, the groom is amazed, overjoyed and proud.

Scripture tells us that we are the bride and he is the bridegroom. The way the groom feels is how Jesus feels about you and me! O that we can grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that

surpasses knowledge! (Ephesians 3:18, 19)

Missions - The Heart of the Church



An update from Caroline Kurtz:

Mark and I have been in a season of not-knowing. According to monks and contemplatives, God can be particularly present, guiding us, when we are aware that we really don't know the future. This has certainly been true for us -- peace in the middle of uncertainty has been an unexpected blessing.

When Mark was laid off in late August he began job-searching. We were shocked, but not terribly surprised when the unemployment agency in Oregon informed him that statistics

show he was unlikely to find another job before retirement in three years. They invited him to start his own business instead -- also a daunting prospect at his age.

Enter a thought we hadn't planned on having: might God have sprung us loose so He could call us into a finisher job overseas?

We've been in a careful process of discernment since that thought occurred to us in October. In March Mark and I flew to Louisville to interview with PCUSA, and now World Mission has called us to serve in the world's newest nation, in the world's newest capital city, Juba, South Sudan!

My position will be Regional Liaison, linking to the partner churches in South Sudan, linking to PCUSA presbyteries and congregations who partner there, and supporting the PCUSA staff in far-flung villages.

Mark will be handling the earth-based needs: logistical support, building supervision (some of these gutsy missionaries are living in tents!), security back-up and trip planning for short-term mission groups.

Support for Caroline now goes through PCUSA World Mission, no longer through the Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship.



NEWS FROM SESSION

Church Alive: Finishing touches are being added to the new IPC Directory. They would like to thank everyone who helped make this Directory possible.

Mission Study Report was conditionally approved by the Presbytery Committee on Ministry on 11 April. This report will be used by PNC as part of the call for candidates. It can be read online at http://issuu.com/ronfong/docs/mission study ipc 2013 v10. Session dismissed the Mission Study Team with appreciation for their work (Deloris Anderson, Lynette Ariathurai, Marion Bade, Nick McClure and Ron Fong).

Session approved sending elder commissioners to Presbytery on May 11.

Pastor 10-Year Celebration will be May 18

Congregational Meeting Sunday April 28 elected a Pastor Nominating Committee of Brook Mantia, Heather Ostdiek, Mary Lee Starkel, Ron Fong, Alishan Merjanian, Lynnette Ariarthurai and Peter Bade. The meeting was moderated by Rev. Randy Young. He shared:

- 1) Rev. Young explained the process and expectations of calling a pastor,. He also shared some factoids to help us understand the issues.
 - There are 10,600 churches in PCUSA and 21,000 ordained ministers. Only 800 or so of the 10,600 churches have multi staff. Roughly 4000 churches have no staff due to finances.
 - There is a surplus of available pastors. PNC should expect to review at least 150 candidates. The plan calls for weekly meetings until the new pastor is found. People who serve should feel called by God, have the commitment to time and energy to serve, and be representative of the congregation
 - Approximately 400-500 churches have a PNC looking for candidates at any one time. An unknown additional number of churches are in transition between pastors without a PNC.
 - The Church Information Form is being renamed a Ministry Information Form. The PNC will complete the form for matching to the candidates. It will require approval of Session and the COM before it can be posted to Louisville. This process will take several months. People can talk to the PNC during this period of time as the MIF is finalized. Once the MIF is completed and approved and the PNC is in the active search phase, then a "cone of silence" falls upon the PNC. They cannot discuss particulars of the search process until they recommend extending a call.
 - When the PNC recommends extending a call, the PNC will most likely provide an opportunity for people to meet the candidate prior to the congregational vote to calling the pastor.
 - If the PNC recommends extending a call to a candidate, and the congregation does not agree, then
 the PNC is dismissed and a new PNC formed. The Congregation does not get to pick between
 candidates. They are reliant upon the PNC to be their representative in finding the right person for
 the call.
 - God already knows who will be the next pastor. The PNC's job is discovering and discerning what God has already planned for IPC.
